## Annual Meeting

Last month we held our annual parish meeting. Special thanks to the Vestry for providing the amazing brunch and all those who stuck around afterwards to help with the clean-up. Besides thanking Ken Gomeringer and Leslie Nutting, who were stepping down from the Vestry as their terms ended, we welcomed two new members to the Vestry, Rick Horejs and Vince Cummings Jr. We also elected Cindy Pekarek as the new Senior Warden and Judy Darrell as the Junior Warden. Marcia (our parish Treasurer), and JR Pekarek (President of our Endowment Board) offered us an update on the financial wellbeing of our parish. While we finished 2023 with a slight deficit, thanks to the generosity of parish members, 2024 prospects look very good. Other items discussed included the possible return of the common cup during communion, the development of a new funeral ministry team, along with the need to paint the outside of the church, make parking lot repairs, and upgrade our online



broadcasting capabilities. Before adjourning the meeting, Fr Tom announced that he would be retiring in June of 2025 and Ken Gomeringer shared a brief summary of the search process that will begin in the near future.





## Fr. Tom's Tidbits

#### Tidbits



As many of you know, I have been talking about my potential retirement for several months. After much prayer, and discussion with the bishop and the Vestry, I announced my planned retirement from full-time parish ministry during our Annual Meeting. Typically, when clergy announce retirement, they leave very soon afterwards. What often follows is about 18 months of turmoil as the parish deals with part-time pastoral care during their search for a new priest. This can be a very tumultuous time in the life of a parish and generally results in an interruption in the work of many of the ministries the parish is involved in.

Our bishop has learned that when a parish is healthy and thriving, when they enjoy a good relationship with their clergy, and the clergy are willing, conducting the search while the retiring clergy remains in place has been very beneficial for both the parish and retiring clergy. Since we meet these criteria, the bishop gladly offered this opportunity to me and the Vestry. It was an easy decision for us to make. Looking 18 months into the future, my planned retirement will be June of 2025, with Sunday 22 Jun **2025** being my last projected service.

Some have asked what I will do after I retire. My first answer, is to spend time with Sharon. For the last 48 years, time for Sharon has often taken second place to the demands of military and clerical life. Our hope is to travel and see some of the places we have always wanted to. My second answer is that I plan to continue being part of the mission and pilgrimage efforts of the diocese, both in the Dominican Republic and regionally with youth. Our home will remain here in Omaha, so there is a real good chance we will run into each other time and again.

Now, just because I have announced my retirement, doesn't mean I am going to sit back and wait for it to happen. We have a lot to do between now and then, and with God's help we will get it all done, making the transition as seamless as possible. There will be time later for farewells. Until then, we will continue to stive to be a place where people meet Christ and grow in their relationship with God through our worship, service, and fellowship.

Once the committee has been selected, the search for our new rector will move forward as we search for the best match for our parish. This is a lengthy process which will take 18-20 months. The good news is that Father Tom will be with us the entire time to lead our church family, thereby helping make our transition as smooth as possible.



## Lent Program 2024

Beginning Sunday (18 Feb), our Sunday evening Lenten Soup and Study will resume starting with a shared soup supper at 5pm, followed by a study beginning at 5:45pm. This year's study will be on the Book of Revelation, following up the questions raised during last year's Lenten study on the formulation of the New Testament.

Using Margaret Feingold's six session DVD study, we will explore how the final book of the Bible is a survival guide for the suffering, a book of promises for the persecuted, and a banner of hope for the beaten down and how it is a reminder for us of God's power and promises during times of great suffering and persecution. 

#### DioNeb Dominican Team

a parent or guardian. We will work out of the Diocesan Camp near Jarabacoa. We expect to be working projects both in the camp and in the local community. Our second trip will be the

week of Sat (6 Jul) - Fri (12 Jul). This trip is for youth 16-20 and will also work in and around the Diocesan camp. Passports are needed for both trips. ## Vestry Meeting Minutes 18 Jan 2024

Vestry Members present: Fr. Tom Jones, Leslie Nutting, Lori Erickson, Judy Darrell, Ken Gomeringer, Barb Smith. Also present: Marcia Adams, Carol McLaughlin

The meeting was opened at 6:35 PM with prayer.

**INFORMATION / UPDATES:** Fr. Tom went over the calendar for the upcoming month. Next week he will be at the Dio-Neb Clergy Retreat. He leaves Tuesday afternoon and will be gone for the remainder of the week. Blood Drive is coming up Feb. 3, Carol reported that 14 of the 20 appointments are filled.

**FINANCIAL REPORT:** Marcia reviewed the December finance reports. Our YTD total contribution income came in at 98.76%. This was an updated report due to a correction made to Rector expenditures; any unused Sabbatical and Professional Development not used gets put into his Fr. Tom's fund to be used at another point in time. Nothing else out of ordinary in this report. Fr. Tom pointed out that although the report shows YTD we came in at -\$3154.07, this does not reflect a late contribution of \$900. So, we are actually closer to \$2,000 in the hole instead of \$3,000. Marcia also commented that the ministry teams did a good job and came in close to budget overall. The Changes in Equity report shows all of the changes that were approved at the December Vestry Meeting. Balance Sheet reviewed: Total Available Assets are \$696,959.39. **M01-18-01:** Judy moved and Lori seconded that we accept the reports as presented. Motion passed with unanimous approval.

Fr. Tom presented the Designated Funds Expense for approval:

### **DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

Leslie updated on the stained glass windows. She met with the artist and discussed design for a panel incorporating a dove. Also discussed a design incorporating a chalice. He will need 20% down up front, then when sketches approved an additional 50%. He said they could be done by late April or May.

Two more delegates are needed for the Dio-Neb Annual Council which will be October 24 – 26 in Hastings. Lori and Leslie said they would like to go as delegates. They will be in addition to Michele and Corey Hagen. Judy volunteered to serve as an alternate.

Fr. Tom handed out copies of his annual rector's report showing attendance at all services for 2023. Principal Services average was 93, which is close to pre-pandemic average.

Proposed dates for the Vestry Retreat are March 8 and 9. Members should let Fr. Tom know if those dates work so he can firm it up. Plan is for the retreat to be held here at CHS.

### **DECISION ITEMS:**

Fr. Tom handed out copies of the 2024 Budget – Approved Amendment 1. The amendment was necessary because we received a last-minute pledge which increased the pledge offering and reduced the non-pledge amount. The pledged amount was more than originally entered as non-pledge. The budget comes in at -\$1256 which is improved from previously. **M01-18-03:** Lori moved and Leslie seconded to accept the Amended Budget as presented. Motion passed with unanimous approval.

Grant Requests: The Endowment Board received a total of 12 Grant Requests. All 12 were approved having met the Endowment Board's criteria. The original requests totaled \$20,100. The total grant money available is \$22,381.

Fr. Tom is recommending that the requests be changed as follows:

The amount for computers was reduced because there was a previous grant authorized and an additional \$2,600 is not needed. Discussion followed on some of the grants requested. **M01-18-04:** Judy moved and Lori seconded the recommended changes. Motion passed with unanimous approval.

There will be a ministry team meeting coming up and vestry members are encouraged to attend. One thing we need each ministry to do is continuity planning. In case of the loss of a key member of the ministry this will allow for a seamless transition. We will be forming a Funeral Ministry team, and a sign-up sheet will be handed out at the Annual Meeting requesting volunteers to sign up for one or more of the functions: Set-up, Cooking, Baking, Kitchen, or Clean-up.

Canon Liz cannot come to our Vestry Retreat. She offered two alternate dates to come and speak to the Vestry: at our March Vestry Meeting or Sunday February 18 in the afternoon. After discussion if was agreed to have her come to the March meeting. We will have our meeting from 5:30 to 6:30 and Canon Liz will meet with us from 6:30 to 7:30.

Of the outgoing Vestry Members, either Judy or Leslie can take on the Junior Warden duties. They will decide between themselves who will assume this position and let Fr. Tom know before the Annual Meeting on Sunday.

Judy stated that the Gift Shop has grant money available for ministries to request. Fr. Tom suggested that purchasing household items to give away at Mobile Pantries might be a good use for this money.

**M01-18-05:** Ken moved and Lori seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed with unanimous approval.
