Fr. Tom's Tidbits



This year has flown by, and it is hard to believe Christmas is once again just around the corner. With Thanksgiving behind us, and an early Easter (31 Mar) before us, we are getting ready for a very busy, and blessed, four months. During our Hospitality and Worship Committee meeting last month, it was hard not to notice the long list of special services needing to be planned for. Come April, I think we will all be ready to take a deep breath and offer a sigh of relief.

As I look back over this past year, there are some real blessings for us to give thanks for, not only as a parish, but as individuals as well. One blessing I wish to share is God's help in sorting out a personal struggle I have been dealing with for the last couple of years; that is the decision of if, and when, to retire from full-time parish ministry. As many of you know, I felt drained by the pandemic, both personally and spiritually. I really didn't know what I would do. Our pilgrimage to the Holy Land helped me realize, that despite my fatigue and frustrations, I was not alone as I thought, God was with me, and through the prayers along our journey, I found a renewed strength to continue; for how much longer I did not know. This year, God helped me answer this question.

My intention is to retire in 2025, most likely no later than the end of June. As alluded to in last month's issue of The Flame, our Vestry has met with the Bishop to discuss the options before us. With the healthy nature of our parish family, the bishop has endorsed a search for my successor while I remain here, serving the community I so dearly love. This is another real blessing. Our parish life will continue uninterrupted, thereby allowing us time to work together to shore up the areas needing attention in order to make for a smooth transition, avoiding the typical disruptions that occur when a long-term interim is used.

Over the next few months, our Vestry will be asking for your help in forming a search committee to do the work needing to be done. Once committee co-chairs have been identified, and the committee is formed, they will then take the lead in collecting the thoughts and prayers of this community, as the process unfolds.

I know my decision to retire is not welcomed by all, and part of me is not ready to do so. But another part of me feels that the time is right. To coin a military phrase, I do not intend on being ROAD (retired on active duty). There is still a lot to do; and my hope is that, together, we will continue to keep moving forward, sharing in a mission and ministry that offers hope to all; a mission and ministry inaugurated by the incarnation we celebrate later this month. May we all share in a blessed and joy-filled celebration. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Vestry Meeting Minutes

November 16, 2023

Members present: Ken Gomeringer, Barb Smith, Kristi Smith, Judy Darrell, Patrick Howell, Fr Tom, and Marcia Adams.

Fr Tom offered an opening prayer at 6:30 pm, after which the Vestry looked over and discussed upcoming parish events.

Marcia led a review of the October Financial Reports. Marcia noted that while our total income for the year is down \$10,000 from what was budgeted, we are only \$4,463 in the red, as some of our expenses have been less than anticipated. There were some higher than normal ministry expenses but all, with the exception of Greeters, fell within their annual budget plan. Greeters had an unexpected expense in the purchase of replacement items for the guest gift bags.

Marcia next reviewed the Funds expenditures for Oct. Movement was noted in the Oktoberfest fund, the Outreach Misc Fund, Mission Fund, Deacon Professional Support Fund and Rector Discretionary Funds. Also noted were the addition of funds given this year for next and a loss in Endowment Fund earnings. Marcia then provided an overview of the balance sheet. We have a total of \$245,880 in cash assets and \$417,456 in our Endowment Fund.

Judy moved to accept the reports as presented. Seconded by Barb. **MO111601** passed by unanimous consent. Kristi made a motion to pay the bills. Seconded by Ken. **MO111602** passed by unanimous consent.

Fr Tom presented the lates draft of our 2024 budget. Noted was that we are still missing a number of offerings from members who regularly give leaving the budget with a unexpected deficit. The good news was that our DioNeb faith asking was considerably less then anticipated. Fr Tom said at Annual Council, he saw he had used the wrong year's income to determine the amount and immediately corrected our planned budget. Several Vestry members agreed to send thank you notes to those who have returned their 2024 estimate of giving cards.


The Vestry took a quick look at the 2024 parish and fundraising calendars. They will be reaching out to our various ministries to see if there are any changes.

Off going members Judy Darrell and Leslie Nutting, along with Ken Gomeringer will comprise our 2024 Vestry Nominating Team. They will be canvasing members to see who might be willing to serve on the Vestry following the Annual Parish Meeting.

Patrick asked if there was any update on the 5G tower plan the diocese was engaging in. Fr Tom said that there was not, we are still waiting to hear if we might be on the survey list.

Fr Tom presented the 2024 faith asking letter from the diocese. Judy moved and Ken seconded the motion we accept our full faith asking payable in 10 payments. **MO111503** passed by unanimous consent.

A motion to adjourn was made by Patrick, seconded by Judy. MO111604 passed by unanimous consent.
