





How to Pray

How to Pray – A Simple Method to Follow

Prayer is the simplest, the most difficult, and the most fundamental duty of all Christians.

Yet, when it comes to being asked to pray, aloud or privately with someone, it is one of the scariest endeavors Christians attempt, if they attempt it at all.

Even minimal daily prayer increases our ability to see God at work around us. As we pray, not only for our own needs but also for those of others, we grow in faith. As we listen for God's voice, we learn to recognize and act on the whispered responses to our prayers. Over time, daily prayer creates in our hearts a flowing spring of praise and thanksgiving to our awesome God.

Why is prayer such a fearful thing? Perhaps it is because many of us believe we are not spiritual enough to pray aloud. All the prayers we have heard were ornate, long, and full of distinguished words. How can we ever pray this way? Have heart, that is not what prayer is meant to be; it is a conversation between you and God. Nothing more, nothing less. But if it is still a fearful thing, the following format may just open up that door for a fuller prayer life.

S. T. A. F.

S - Salutation; T - Thankfulness; A - Ask; and, F - finish.

This is a simple format for prayer anyone can use. Paul's prayer in Ephesians 3:14-21 is a wonderful example of the S.T.A.F. method.

Salutation: "For this reason, I kneel before the Father ..."

Thankfulness: "... from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name."

Ask: "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more that all we ask (insert request)"

Finish: "... according to his power ... to him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations."

Amen: Sealed in trust, faith, and truth.

There you have it: short, sweet, and to the point. A simple way of formatting a prayer, aloud with another. No fancy words, no long oration, just plain simple words spoken with God. So, "Lord, what will you have me do?"

Lay Eucharistic Visitor Training


Youth



Vestry Meeting Minutes 18 May 2023

Fr Tom opened the meeting with prayer.

Members present: Ken Gomeringer, Cindy Pekarek, Leslie Nutting, Judy Darrell, Lori Erickson, Barb Smith, Fr. Tom.

During the look at upcoming events, it was noted that the planned Parish Clean-up day needed to be rescheduled and that the Bell Choir would be playing for both Pentecost and the Bishop's visit in June.

Treasurer's Report:

Marcia was not unable to attend, so Fr. Tom gave our financial update. - Beginning with the Budget-vs-Actual report, it was noted that year t date we are at 98% on pledge giving received and or total operating income is at 102%. The slight drop in total income is the balancing out of earlier large sum giving. Under expenses, Altar Guild had a larger than normal expense for Easter flowers, Outreach for their budgeted contributions to neighborhood ministries, and Lawn service for the prepayment of lawn treatments. Year to date, income exceeds expenses by \$3,398.

The Vestry reviewed all fund expenditures for the month of April. included in these expenditures:

Our Endowment Fund grew by \$3,377 in April. So far this year we have been blessed with slow, but steady growth. **MO-05-18-01** was made by Lori Erickson to accept the reports as presented. Seconded by Cindy Pekarek. Motion passed with unanimous consent. **MO 05-18-02** was made by Judy Darrell to pay the bills, seconded by Leslie Nutting; motion passed with unanimous consent.

Discussion Items:

During the past month, we received several thank you notes from organizations we donated to as part of our Outreach ministry. A comment was made that it was nice that they acknowledged the gift.

Fr. Tom offered an update on our new camera installation. All cables have been run. What is needed next is for us to install connectors and mount cameras. Fr. Tom is hoping to complete this during our next parish clean-up day.

A new sign for outside the office is ready for installation. Waiting for our building committee to place posts. Project expected to be complete before the bishop's arrive in mid-June.

Our Spirit Hub ministry is about to begin, Jean is working with ministry team leaders to gather the names of all volunteers who will be hosting,

VBS is around the corner and Cindy is soliciting volunteers to help with the prep and during VBS (26-29 Jun 6:00 -8:00pm). Cindy will hold prep workshops in the classrooms between now and VBS.

A recommendation was made to have the Scouts de-weed the area under and around their trailers. Fr. Tom will reach out to our Scoutmasters to coordinate this.

A recommendation was made that with new babies and younger children joining us for worship, it was time to seek a second Nursey Monitor to more fully comply with the church's Safeguarding God's Children program. Fr. Tom will reach out to Marcia for recommendations before beginning a parish search.

Decision Items:

With an increase in interest now being paid on our savings account, the Finance Committee recommended we transfer surplus funds from checking to savings. The Vestry concurred. Fr. Tom to provide Corey with written approval to move funds leaving at least 3 months of funding to cover expected and unexpected expenses.

Fr. Tom asked to move \$5,000 from the discretionary fund in support of parish ministries: \$3,000 to the Camp and Mission Scholarship Fund, \$1,000 to the Outreach Miscellaneous Fund, and \$1,000 to the Building Fund. **MO-05-18-03** was made by Fr. Tom to move the requested funds, seconded by Ken Gomeringer, motion passed with unanimous consent.

The purchase of a secure mailbox, discussed during a previous Vestry meeting, following our stolen mail incident, will be made over the next two weeks. A new and more secure post will be installed along with the posts for our new signage. The Vestry concurred with the purchase.

Fr. Tom received a request by our Magdalene Omaha ministry to help support a new summer water bottle ministry being undertaken at Magdalene House. They are in need of an outdoor canopy, weights for the canopy legs, and both a large and medium size cooler. The estimated cost for these items is \$350. Funding would be provided through our Outreach Misc Fund. As part of the discussion, a point was raised how such canopies would be useful for mobile pantries and other parish activities (also to be funded through our Outreach Misc Fund). The Vestry concurred with the request to provide Magdalene Omaha requested equipment, and to purchase 3 additional canopies for use by CHS.


The meeting was adjourned at 7:30pm. Our next meeting is scheduled for 15 Jun 23 at 6:30pm.
