As I write, I am still recovering from our Journey's prayer pilgrimage. What an amazing week we had together. Not only did we enjoy the hospitality of 10 different congregations, and see some interesting sites along the way, but for me, it was truly spiritually refreshing. Watching and listening to our youth pray with joy in their hearts was an experience I wish we all could have been blessed with. I know that they were not always excited about praying for the congregations, let's face it, long drives between churches is not all that fun, but when it came time to pray, there was an energy that just filled both the church and those who were there. Congregations were so thankful for the message of hope our

prayers offered.


I got to thinking, when was the last time we felt that kind of energy when we gathered together to pray. The craziness of our week can be just as debilitating as a long car ride; and while we don't always lead the prayers we share, we are invited (like the congregations we visited) not to sit passively as another prays, but to share in the prayers being offered, saying them, either to ourselves, or out loud. Prayer, as our youth experienced, can make a difference. Not only does it lift us up when we're down, it can lift up others as well, restoring and refreshing hope in the love, grace, and mercy prayer brings to the forefront.

In Paul's first letter to Timothy, he reminds Timothy, and those who Timothy serves, that even in the tough times, it is God's will that we not quench the Spirit, that we seek joy in what we experience and where we are, that we give thanks for not only the good times, but the strength God's love gives us when things aren't going well, and to pray without ceasing, for it is in prayer we find joy and can give thanks. I will admit, prayer is not always at the top of my list of things to do. Like everyone, I get distracted, and setting aside time each day is a challenge. Something I have learned to accept over the years, when it comes to prayer, is that some days will be better than others, and on those days I fall short, instead of berating my lack of self-discipline, I remind myself that God knows the prayers I carry with me, and that whether I am intentional in my efforts or not, God hears them, and for that I give thanks.

As we move through the season after Pentecost, listening to the stories we hear each week in Scripture, I encourage each of us, in prayer, to ask God to help us understand how they nurture us; what is it about them that we connect with, assuring us of the love God has for us; and then to do something we often forget to do when we pray, wait for an answer. As our youth learned on pilgrimage, and as I believe Paul taught, it is God's response to prayer that warms the heart and changes the way we see things or the way we feel, allowing us to find joy in the moment, joy we are then able to share with others. Therefore, let us go forth and pray, Alleluia, Alleluia.



Fun Plex Youth and Family Outing

Last year's youth outing to Fun Plex was such a success, we are doing it again this year. Our planned event will be held on Wednesday (26 Jul) starting at 1pm. Provided we have 20 or more individuals sign up to attend, the group rate is \$25 per person. Our Youth Activities Fund will offer a \$15 scholarship to parish youth 3-18 and a \$10



scholarship to other family members. To receive a scholarship, those wishing to attend must sign up at the Spirit Hub by Sunday (16 Jul). Tickets will be handed out on Sunday (23 Jul). The cost for friends of parish members will be \$25 per person. Please Note: While our event is planned for a specific date, tickets may be used at anytime the park is open. Ticket holders can arrive earlier in the day or if not able to attend, visit the park any other day of the week. Those registered at the Spirit Hub, as of 16 Jun, will be expected to pay the non-scholarship amount.

Youth Pilgrimage

This past month our Journeys Youth group traveled around the diocese on their first pilgrimage since 2013. On this trip, our youth traveled over 1400 miles, spending 28 hours in a vehicle, as they visited 10 different parishes, offering prayers for each community. Those we visited were Our Savior in North Platte, St. Paul's in Ogallala, St George's in Oshkosh, St. Matthew's in Alliance, St. Francis in Scottsbluff, Grace Church in Chadron, St. Mary's Holly in Rushville, St. John's in



Valentine, St. Mary's in Bassett, and Grace Church in Columbus. At each parish, our team was greeted by members of the parish who gladly shared something about their community, and how they served those in the surrounding area, joining our team in prayer.



While the focus of our pilgrimage was spiritual in nature, we also stopped along the way visiting some fun sites, learning more about the state our diocese serves. Among the places visited were the: Archway Museum in Kearney, The Golden Spike Tower, Carhenge, Scottsbluff (atop which we also celebrated Eucharist), Fort Robinson State Park (where they went horseback riding, swimming, and enjoyed a Church Wagon dinner) Smith



Falls (taking time to swim in the Niobrara River), and Ashfall Fossil Bed. As a side trip we also visited the Crazy Horse Monument and Mt Rushmore.









Vestry Meeting Minutes

15 June 2023

Vestry Members present: Fr. Tom Jones, Judy Darrell, Ken Gomeringer, Leslie Nutting, Barb Smith, Kristi Smith, Lori Erickson, Cindy Pekarek. Also present: Marcia Adams, Treasurer and Carol McLaughlin, Recorder

The meeting was opened at 6:30 PM with prayer.

INFORMATION / UPDATES:

Members were briefed on upcoming events.

TREASURERS REPORT:

Marcia presented the financial update. In the Budget vs. Actual report, it was noted that income is up for the month. The expense for Insurance – Liability represents a quarterly payment and the expense for HVAC is the 6-month premium for our maintenance contract. YTD Income exceeds expenses by \$2,866.67. In the CIE report, one thing of note is the \$5746.02 deducted from Rector's Discretionary Fund. This was approved at last month's meeting: the money was moved and dispersed between the Outreach Miscellaneous, the Camp and Mission Scholarship, and the Building Funds. The Endowment Fund lost money last month. Summary of Balance Sheet: Net Cash Assets are \$237,688. Total Available Assets are \$660,109. Outstanding checks total \$7,086.92. **M06-15-01:** Cindy moved that the reports be accepted as presented. Lori seconded. Unanimous approval. **M06-15-02:** Judy moved that we pay the bills. Kristi seconded. Unanimous approval.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Fr. Tom provided an update on the new security camera installation. This is still ongoing as there are changes necessary to the wiring. Alan is taking a look at what is still needed to get them operational.

Santa Ana donations: The donation money is ready to go; the project is approved, we just need to receive actual quotes for the work before we can send the money.

Recertifications for Safeguarding God's Children: Cindy advised that anyone who may be working with youth in any capacity will need to be recertified. She needs to receive email addresses in order for the diocese to get people registered for the recertification.

Potential new Outreach project: Bomba Sock Donation (one pair donated for every pair purchased) was suggested by a parish member. Since we don't know much about how this program works, Patrick will look into it and get details for us to review next month.

Arrows to Aerospace Parade: We have not entered a float in this parade for several years, Fr. Tom asked if there was enough interest to resume our participation in the parade this year. Barb presented ideas for simple and effective float designs. If we can find someone in the parish who will step up to coordinate this, and if enough participants will get involved we will proceed with this. The parade is scheduled for August 19.

Sudanese – Location Sharing: The Bishop will have a conference call between us, St. Martha's and Church of the Resurrection to discuss this. Once some more questions are answered and details provided we can make an informed decision. Whether the Sudanese community would become part of our congregation, or maintain their own membership and service schedule while using this facility is unknown.

VBS: Cindy reported on the number of children attending and said she now has enough volunteer help recruited.

DECISION ITEMS:

Fr. Tom proposed that we switch two events on the August calendar. He wants to move the Parish Picnic to August 13, and move the Sunday School Open House to August 20. Members agreed with this change. The picnic location will again be at Betz Park on Betz Road from 11:00 to 3:00. Judy will arrange to reserve the location with the city of Bellevue. (Post meeting Note: Pavilion has been reserved)

Sundry Items for Mobile Pantry (packets of personal and toiletry items): These were scheduled to be given out at the next mobile pantry, however that pantry already has some special food items to give out (ground beef and milk). Therefore, it was agreed to have the personal item packets distributed at the August pantry instead.

Fr. Tom went around the table for additional items. Judy brought up the schedule for Christmas services, since Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year. No decisions have been made as to which services the choir and bell choirs will perform, however Fr. Tom does intend to have both morning services on Christmas Eve as well as the usual 3 evening services.

There was no further business. **M06-15-03:** Cindy moved that the meeting adjourn. Patrick seconded. Unanimous approval.


