Fr. Tom's Tidbits

Vestry Meeting Minutes

October 12, 2023

Vestry Members present: Fr. Tom Jones, Lori Erickson, Kristi Smith, Cindy Pekarek, Barb Smith, Leslie Nutting, Ken Gomeringer

Also present: Bishop Scott Barker, Canon Liz Easton, Carol McLaughlin, Recorder

The meeting was opened at 6:30 PM with prayer.

Fr. Tom began by handing out the paperwork to be signed for Terri Storm's candidacy for the Deaconate. He then announced that the agenda would be set aside until after a presentation and discussion led by Canon Liz Easton regarding the search for a new pastor following Fr. Tom's retirement.

Bishop Barker opened with remarks leading to Canon Liz' presentation. He then introduced Canon Liz to the Vestry. After her introductory remarks, Fr. Tom left the meeting as he will not be able to be a part of the search for a new priest.

Canon Liz then went over the process we can expect in the search for the new priest. She provided a handout titled Search Process Basics. A copy of this handout will be in the mailbox of those vestry members not present at this meeting. She detailed the process and took questions from vestry members.

Following her presentation, Fr. Tom rejoined the meeting and the Bishop and Canon Liz left.

INFORMATION / UPDATES:

Fr. Tom went over the upcoming event calendar. He detailed plans for the Trunk or Treat on Oct. 29. Thanksgiving boxes will be packed following the Mobile Pantry on Nov. 18.

TREASURERS REPORT:

<u>Budget vs.</u> Actuals: Our pledges are down a bit this month, also our Total Operating Income is about 2-3% down from where we normally are. This is not a real concern as the finance committee feels we will finish the year in good shape. A few other expense items were discussed. Most expenses were as expected. We are still about \$10,000 in the hole but with what we believe is coming in yet, we think we will be ok.

<u>Changes in Equity:</u> Under expenses there was expense for Oktoberfest. Under FHFO we sent Magdalene their \$906. \$5000 was moved from Discretionary Fund to Building Fund per our motion and approval last month. \$120 under Special Offering Fund was for our new "Give Thanks" banner. \$1,400 out of landscaping fund was for the plants and everything for the scout project out front as well as the work done outside the office door. We lost \$12,000 in the Endowment Fund last month.

Motion M10-12-01: Lori moved to accept the reports as presented. Cindy seconded. Approved unanimously. Motion M10-12-02: Leslie moved to pay the bills. Kristi seconded. Approved unanimously.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Draft #3 of the 2024 Budget was given to members. This month gives us a better look at what our 2023 estimates will be. The amounts bolded in red indicate changes from last month's draft. Under Income, Plate offering and Building Use were adjusted somewhat downward based on what we have seen so far this year. Some items under Operating Expense were explained. Under Ministry Expenses, all items are highlighted in red. This indicates that all Ministries have submitted their budget requests and these are the numbers they have provided. Total Expenses are budgeted at \$245,022. Income estimated at \$236,628. This leaves a deficit of \$8394. \$7,000 of that is the increased Diocesan asking. We do have savings in all ministries plus money from Werner Park that is enough to cover the deficit if necessary.

Status of Pledge Drive as of today was handed out. Our goal is \$215.478. So far we have received pledges totaling \$92,542. Taking into consideration non-pledge items and offerings and other income, we are at about \$138,000 in the hole, however it is still early. 17 total pledges have been received so far.

Update on Bomba Sock donation set aside as Patrick was not in attendance.

Update on purchase of new stained glass window by Leslie: She has provided details of what we want to a provider and is waiting for their reply. She will follow up if response not received in a week.

Trunk or Treat: Fr. Tom said that flyers will be ready for handing out; they will be put on doors throughout the neighborhood. There are plans to promote the event on NextDoor, Facebook, and other social media. We had over 200 kids last year, we are hoping for a similar turnout again. There will also be games inside and a drawing for a gift certificate.

The Vestry Christmas dinner will be on December 8 at 6:00 PM.

Note: Please do not unlock the blue door on Sundays. It has to be manually re-locked and is easily overlooked.

Lisa Aguilar will be the supply clergy when Fr. Tom is in the DR on Nov. 4–5. Kristi volunteered to come and open up the building for the Saturday service.

The Bishop has advised that Ted Powell has been approved and can move forward with his ordination as Deacon.

DECISION ITEMS:

No decision items, other than the paperwork for Terri Storm, which was given out at the beginning of the meeting.

There was no further business. **Motion M10-12-03:** Leslie moved that the meeting adjourn. Kristi seconded. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 7:50 PM
