Deacons Corner

Greetings!!

The Lord is Risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!!!

We often hear people refer to an unexplainable event as a "miracle," and we have become a bit too used to hearing the term used out of context and meaning. The good that Jesus did was miraculous in so many ways and had no explanation for what took place other than it was an "act of God." We often hear the term "act of God" today as it references tragic events such as hurricanes and tornadoes. But the acts of God Jesus did were good things!

The miracles of Jesus were never intended to be spectacles for the entertainment of the crowd. They were meant to lead hearts to Him, but many hearts were hard. Indeed, Jesus rebuked the Pharisees, who asked to see a sign after He had performed many, calling them "wicked and perverse" (Matthew 12:39). Jesus lamented humanity's desire to see signs and wonders — the desire for the spectacular—because it got in the way of faith. His goal was not to satisfy human curiosity but to lead hearts to believe in Him for salvation. The ultimate purpose of every miracle was not the immediate physical relief of the broken but the revelation of Jesus as the Savior of mankind.

When Jesus called Lazarus out of the tomb, He was foreshadowing His own resurrection, proving that He alone holds the keys to life and death. In raising Lazarus, Jesus assures all who trust in Him as Savior and Lord that they too will rise — and not just physically. When we believe in Christ, He awakens our dead spirits so that even on this side of heaven we can experience abundant life through Him.

I wish a blessed and joyous Easter to you and yours.

Our new online giving platform is up and running on our website. We are switching over to one provided by Servant Keeper, the same company that we use for parish administration and finances. In addition to lower fees for online giving, Servant Keeper also allows online donors to cover the cost as part of, or in addition to, their offering. Another feature that we encourage members to take advantage of is the ability to sign into Servant Keeper when making a donation. If you use the same email that you have on file with the church, your donation

should be seamlessly entered into the system. If you do not wish to create a sign-in, while we will still receive your donation, we will be unable to designate it to your giving account as they will appear as anonymous donations. Youth Summer Pilgrimage



Planning is underway for our summer pilgrimage. This year our youth will be heading out to Alliance, NE. While there, we will be staying at St. Matthew's (Mother Kim Culp's parish). Our plan is to spend part of a day on a working ranch learning about life in rural Nebraska, getting a tour of a local recycling plant (and possibly helping sort some of what they recycle), serving during a neighborhood lunch for the homeless, as well as doing a little sightseeing and spending time in worship, and most importantly at the city pool. This trip is open to all parish youth 12-18. Adult chaperones are needed. The cost for this trip is \$300 per person. Parish scholarships are available to all participants to help offset the costs. Vestry Meeting Minutes April 10, 2025

Vestry Members present: Fr. Tom Jones, Cindy Pekarek, Margie Crawford, Rick Horejs, Judy Darrel, Vince Cummings, Barb Smith, Brian Caskie, Marsha Adams-Treasurer

Fr. Tom opened the meeting with prayer.

Search Committee Report: Cindy said in the next month the search committee will have a social gathering to meet and get to know the candidate & their spouse. Bill and Marsha said the search committee is right on track and where we are supposed to be. They are working on another in-person meeting rather than Zoom.

Finance Report: Marsha presented the financials for the month.

Looking at budget vs actuals we are currently at 116% for the pledge offering. This will dip during the summer months. Under expenditures, the copier fees were \$834. That was for 2 quarterly bills that were sent late by the copier company. Workman's Compensation Insurance is \$695, that is a yearly payment and under the budget. Snow removal was higher than the monthly budget at \$1070 because it included 2 bills for February and March. We pay based on how much snow we get. Our total expenses are 95% for the year.

Looking at the Change in Equity, we moved a lot of money because of vestry motions, the lighting project and the roof project. Grants were also distributed. The \$10,000 drop in the endowment funds is because of the stock market

On the balance sheet we have many outstanding checks mostly because many of them were written at the very end of the month.

M04-10-01: Barb moved, and Judy seconded to accept the reports as presented. Motion passed with unanimous approval. M04-10-02: Vince motioned, and Judy seconded that we pay the bills. Passed with unanimous approval.

Because of a Rausman grant, the diocese will pay us back for the cost of the meat and the laundry detergent. We have \$288 left in the grant for future pantries.

Altar guild will also order a new frontal, ambo (lectern) hanging, and a new burse & veil to match the chasuble. This is the set that is coming apart.
