Fr. Tom's Tidbits

It is amazing at how quickly this year has flown by. It is hard to believe summer has come and gone. In just a few months our focus on how hot it is will be replaced with fall, then winter coats. The trees will soon change color and shed their leaves; the green grass will give way to layers of white snow. The good news is that, no sooner will all this happen, we will be looking ahead to the return of nature's beauty revealed each spring. How can we know for sure? We



know because along the way, we have witnessed this pattern time and again, and we have learned that it is the way nature has functioned from the beginning. Like us, nature springs to life as the warmth of the sun unleashes stored up energy, and as the warmth begins to fade, it rests and prepares itself for when warmth returns.

Just as we know winter is coming with the change in dropping temperatures, and changing color of the leaves, we know these things also bring to the forefront a change in the church as well. In our gospel readings, we will see a change as Jesus shifts his focus from teaching the masses, to preparing the disciples for what is to come, and for the work they will soon be entrusted with. Soon it will be time for them to take what they have been given and use it to carry on his work of reconciliation in the world. In the parables, Jesus often describes this preparation as a time of harvesting, gathering the fruits of the land, the blessings God has provided, not to store them so we can rest comfortably, but so that they might be used to prepare for what is next.

What is next? In the church year, a very busy six months, during which, Scripture encapsulates the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Like the disciples, Jesus' teaching over the next few months will prepare us for the work entrusted to us. As we enter our own season of preparation, we are reminded that like the disciples, we are not to sit idly taking it in, but actively doing what needs to be done, harvesting from the fruits of our labors, from the blessings God has given, so that we are ready for what is to come.

As a community, what fruits, what blessings do we look to harvest? All things needed to empower us to do what we are called to do, beginning with ourselves. This past season after Pentecost has been one of growing and maturing for each of us. It is time to take what we have become and use it, be it our deepening relationships with God and one another, our awareness of God's love, or our sense of calling to serve our neighbor. Giving of ourselves in this way is not any easier than the giving Jesus asked of and prepared the disciples for. The good news is we are not asked to do this on our own. Jesus said he would be there to help them, and us though the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, the same spirit that binds us together as a community, and that working in and through us, enables us to do more than we could ever imagine.

Vestry Meeting Minutes August 17, 2023

Vestry Members present: Fr. Tom Jones, Cindy Pekarek, Barb Smith, Leslie Nutting, Ken Gomeringer, Judy Darrell, Lori Erickson. Also present: Marcia Adams, Treasurer and Carol McLaughlin, Recorder

The meeting was opened at 6:35 PM with prayer.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Marcia Adams presented the financials for July.

Budget vs. Actuals report: YTD total operating income is at 98%. In expenses, most everything was within normal limits. Fr. Tom pointed out one item under Administrative; Website expense of \$528 represented a payment for two years, which saves us money over paying annually.

Changes in Equity report: Nothing out of the ordinary. Endowment fund was up this month.

Balance Sheet: Net Cash Assets \$232,013.56. Total Available Assets \$674,209.95. Outstanding Checks: \$1,903.85.

Fr. Tom presented the following Designated Fund Expenditure requests to be signed:

Fr. Tom notified the Vestry of a recent expense approved by the Executive Committee for replacement of some sidewalk sections. Two sections were damaged by a neighbor's contractor's forklift. We also have some additional sections that need to be replaced at the same time; bid for \$1,800 has been received. The contractor will be billed for \$528 of this as their share.

Motion M08-17-01: Barb moved that the reports be accepted as presented. Lori seconded. Approved unanimously. **Motion M08-17-02:** Judy moved that we pay the bills. Leslie seconded. Approved unanimously.

EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT: Scout Isaiah Horejs presented an idea for an Eagle Scout project. He proposes to landscape the circle drive area at the front of the church where the large pine trees were removed. Two trees, which will be provided by the church, will be planted, and surrounded by landscaping consisting of small shrubs and flower annuals. He will also make sure the trees are watered daily for the first month. There was discussion as to placement and types of plants as well as edging and mulch. He also proposes to clean up the ground inside the fenced area, removing volunteer trees that have grown there, then spraying and placing plastic sheeting to prevent further unwanted growth. The vestry approved the project's concept and he will proceed with developing his project proposal and submit the paperwork to Fr. Tom for final Vestry approval.

UPCOMIING EVENTS: Fr. Tom went over the calendar events for the next month. The next Mobile Pantry is

August 26, and it will include giving out a bag filled with personal items and toiletries. Volunteers to come early on the day of the pantry to assemble these bags will be appreciated. Also noted was that the office will be closed on September 4 for the Labor Day holiday.

DISCUSSION ITEMS / UPDATES:

Fr. Tom provided an update on the organist search. A new organist has been hired, she will start sometime in October. She will start at \$125 per Sunday during a probationary period, and will then move to \$150.

Cindy advised that the Safeguarding God's Children recertifications are progressing well, almost all have now been recertified.

Barb discussed the float and plans for the Arrows to Aerospace parade this coming weekend. The float assembly will be Friday August 18 at 5 pm.

Leslie updated the Vestry on her search for a provider for an additional stained glass window. She will continue to research this.

Fr. Tom advised that we were not selected as the location for the Sudanese Ministry. They have elected to go to St. Martha's.

Fr. Tom handed out Draft 2 of the 2024 Budget. Right now we are on track to finish out around 99% for total giving. Income growth is projected to be at the 3% level this year. Some areas of change were pointed out. Biggest jump in 2024 will be in Diocesan Asking, going from \$22,101 to \$29,024. This will put us over budget next year. The budgeted estimates for organist and supply musician salaries were explained. Ministry spending is not expected to change much. Right now, we are at about negative \$8,500. This is primarily attributed to the increase in Diocesan Asking.

Christmas Eve Worship schedule: A simple morning service will be offered on Sunday, Christmas Eve morning, at 9:30 am. There will be no 8:00am service. Then the usual three Christmas Eve services will be held at 5:00 pm, 7:00 pm and 10:00 pm. These three will all have Bell Choir and Vocal Choir. Christmas Day will be one service as usual at 10:00 am.

The Red Cross has contacted us to offer a date of February 3 for our next Blood Drive. There are no conflicts with that date at this time, so Carol will confirm with the Red Cross to put us on the schedule.

Judy advised that the gift shop will be putting out all merchandise for clearance to make ready for new merchandise.

DECISION ITEMS:

The sidewalk repair previously discussed during the Treasurer's Report / Fund Disbursement was put to vote. **Motion M08-17-03:** Barb moved that we proceed with the sidewalk repair. Cindy seconded. Unanimous approval.

Fr. Tom would like the Vestry's approval to hire a landscape company to provide a solution to the drainage runoff and other problems outside the blue office door. Some landscape companies were proposed for consideration. No one objected to this project.

The resolution for allowing the option to do The Peace at the beginning of services has been finalized. **Motion M08-17-04:** Fr. Tom moved that we now forward this to the legislative committee of the Diocese so that it can be submitted for review and approval at Annual Council. Leslie seconded. Approved unanimously.

Motion M08-17-05: Judy moved that the meeting adjourn. Barb seconded. Approved.

Next scheduled meeting of the Vestry will be September 14, 2023.
