People We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

Reader Holy Trinity, one God, in you we live and move and have our being;

People We praise you and thank you, O Lord.

Reader Lord, grant your healing grace to all who are sick, injured, or disabled, that they may be made whole:

People Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader Grant to all who seek your guidance, and to all who are lonely, anxious, or despondent, a knowledge of your will and an awareness of your presence;

People Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader Mend broken relationships, and restore those in emotional distress to soundness of mind and serenity of spirit;

People Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader Bless physicians, nurses, and all others who minister to the suffering, granting them wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience;

People Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader Grant to the dying peace and a holy death, and uphold by the grace and consolation of your Holy Spirit those who are bereaved;

People Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader Restore to wholeness whatever is broken by human sin, in our lives, in our nation, and in the world;

People Hear us, O Lord of life.

Reader You are the Lord who does wonders:

People You have declared your power among the peoples.

Reader With you, O Lord, is the well of life:

People And in your light we see light.

Reader Hear us, O Lord of life:

People Heal us, and make us whole.

A period of silence follows, after which, the Celebrant concludes the Prayers with one of the following or some other suitable Collect:

Almighty God, giver of life and health: Send your blessing on all who are sick, and upon those who minister to them, that all weakness may be vanquished by the triumph of the risen Christ; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

O Lord our God, accept the fervent prayers of your people; in the multitude of your mercies look with compassion upon us and all who turn to you for help; for you are gracious, O lover of souls, and to you we give glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.

Confession of Need

Celebrant Let us confess our need for God's healing grace.

A period of silence follows, after which the Celebrant and the People say

Compassionate God, we confess our weaknesses and our need for your strengthening touch. We confess that some illnesses stem from our own fault, while others are outside our control. We turn to you, source of life, and we ask in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ for the gifts of true healing and life in you. Amen

The Celebrant continues:

May the God of love visit you in your times of trial and weakness, and raise you to the newness of life, through Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen Almighty God, whose will it is to hold heaven and earth in the peace of your kingdom, give peace to your church, peace among nations, peace in our homes, and peace in our hearts. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Walk in love as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God. Amen
